This year's presenters were Patrick Boyns, principal at the British Bible School in Corby, England, who spoke on "Aspects of leadership", as well as Doyle Kee, missionary in Geneva, who has established and served Churches of Christ in Switzerland since 1970. Doyle talked about "Modern Idolatry and the Mission Task". It was a wonderful blessing to spend some time with Patrick and Doyle, whom we have known for several years. A third speaker was Craig Young, minister of the church in Marseille, France, whose topic was "Leadership Emergence".

All three brothers are excellent and experienced communicators, whose teachings helped us to gain more insight into their chosen topics and strengthened our faith, but our personal highlight was definitely this year's key note speaker Jim McGuiggan. Jim has been preaching and teaching the gospel for over forty years and is the author of many Christian books, including the popular book

"The God of the Towel". We fell in love with this humble, devoted men, who has a deep love and passion for God and people, as well as a God-given talent to glorify Him and make the Scriptures come alive. If you don't know the "God of the Towel", we recommend the book wholeheartedly.
