Sharing Christ's Birth with the Blind

December 23, 2015, Chaiya, director of the Blind school next to the church building invited me to share

the story of Christ's birth to about 100 blind students. Although, the Presbyterian foundation and the Buddhist support this



blind school, it was a great moment to tell these young people about Christ.

Chaiya told me that when they began this school, most of the teachers and workers were members of the Presbyterian Church. However, times had changed and now most of the workers and teachers are Buddhists. Even, my friend, Chaiya, is not Presbyterian but Catholic.

In the past, our Bible School students helped the Blind School children when the floods rose chest high. We carried the blind students and their belongings out to higher ground. Today when it rains, the Blind School still has flooding because they did not level up their property. However, it is not as bad as it was in the past since the government fixed up draining system. Also, the city municipal sends out trucks to help pump out the water from their school. During the flooding, the teachers and workers there had to park their cars and motorcycles on our church land. This is an annual event June-September during the monsoon season.

Back on the Radio



December 24, 2015, another friend, Thirayuth, a radio station manager in Khon Kaen, asked me to also tell the story of

the birth of Christ on air with Christmas songs playing softly in the background.

Twenty years ago I spent five years doing radio work with the World Radio. I had to stop temporarily because I wanted to spend time establishing churches in twenty northeastern provinces and another twenty churches in the district area. So when my friend asked me, I took the opportunity. It was a great feeling to put the headphones on again.

Lord willing, I would like to return to radio work again when I reach seventy years old or after retiring from the KKBI. At that age, I would think it is best for me to serve the Lord by staying closer to home and going on radio again. Please pray that God will give me good health to be able to do it.
